A Season of Gratitude ~ October 17th - November 21st

For the six weeks after the Fair, and before the beginning of Advent we will be celebrating at the Fryeburg New Church a *Season of Gratitude*. Each week our Sunday School Classes will reflect on something that they hold in gratitude to the Lord, and in worship we too will focus on how we as a church community can transform our hearts at anytime into hearts of gratitude. During our community prayer time where we often bring forward prayers for healing and help we would invite you also to include prayers of thanksgiving and gratitude. This will be the theme of our worship life on Sunday mornings, and we would also invite you to make this a theme of your daily life as well.

One powerful personal practice that we would offer is to keep a gratitude journal for these 6 weeks. Each morning and evening we would invite you to write down something that you are grateful for. And try not to write the same thing twice!
