Dear Friends,

The summer days are waning, a few lone trees have taken on their fall colors, and a new church year is about to begin! While this has been a wonderful summer for me with great times at Convention and Church Camp, and of course enjoying all of the amazing summer offerings of this Mount Washington Valley that we live in, I have to say I am really excited to settle back into the routines of the church year. Returning to our 10 am worship schedule, welcoming our Sunday School children back to classes, and resuming our regular meetings and collaborations with the many committees that keep this church going day after day! This time of year always feels like a new start, a time to set new intentions, and to make plans about what this year will be about.

Here at the New Church lots of planning has been happening this summer that has revolved around an intention that the 2011-2012 church year be a year of building community connections.

Within our Sunday School we have been marking out special days throughout the year where the Sunday School Children will get a chance to work together with all the different age groups and then share what they have been learning with the congregation, in an effort to build more community connections between the children, the congregation and Sunday School parents. We have also started a new FNC Sunday School Facebook page with the hopes of keeping parents and other Sunday School

children family members current with what's happening in their classes so they can stay involved.

We are also beginning to form at FNC what is being called our **Congregational Care Team**. Still in it's early stages, members and friends of the congregation are starting to share what kinds of things they'd like to do to offer care to members of the church, and to brainstorm best practices for caring for all those who come through our doors. If this is of interest to you mark your calendar for our next development meeting after worship on September 11th.

And on my part I am searching out the best kinds of offerings I can make for small group gatherings where members and friends of our church can gather together with one another. Only a couple are planned so far, but I am in hopes that other groups will form based on the ideas that you all bring to me!

So far I have planned two new regular drop in opportunities this year.

Every Thursday at lunch time (noon-1, but feel free to come early) there will be a drop in brown bag lunch informal bible study. If your lunch hour is free stop in, to eat together, and to share any thoughts you may have on the upcoming bible lessons for worship that week. No bible expertise necessary! On the second Tuesday of every month at 7 pm I will be hosting a Spiritual Story Hour, in the church library. Myself and volunteers will read aloud

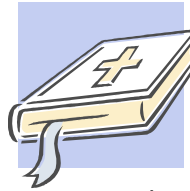
