This month we celebrate the most important event in the history of the world: the resurrection of Jesus Christ. As Christmas is the beginning and the means, Easter is the end and the purpose. And, as I stand there a part of our little morning community, when the sun comes up over the hills and I must close my eyes to the overwhelming brightness, and at the same time shiver as the welcome rays send warmth through my cold body, I am reminded that no matter how dark my days or my nights may seem, the Lord is here to brighten my days and to warm my heart. It is Easter morning. During this joyous time, may we each, individually, as families and as a church community that is a part of the larger community, recognize and give thanks for the gift of life the Lord has given us. And because of what we celebrate on Easter, we know that life is for our time here on earth, but that there is also a place in the house God prepared for each and everyone one of us, made ready and waiting to welcome us for the rest of eternity. That is something worth celebrating. And so it is with joy that I wish everyone a most happy Easter.

Youth Group

It's been a few months since the last Youth Group update. Here's what we've been up to.

In December the youth group gathered at the Fryeburg church to discuss Judaism and celebrate Hanukkah. The group played a Jewish matching game then we spun the dreidel, ate some great potato latkes, lit the menorah while reciting the blessings and celebrated the Festival of Lights by swapping gifts. It was a great holiday celebration, especially since we followed the wonderful children's Christmas Pageant.

Our January and February youth group meetings were held at the Portland New Church where we discussed the eastern religions of Hinduism and Confucianism. For our January

Hindu gathering we listened to traditional Indian Sitar music, ate Channa Masala, looked at pictures of the major Hindu Deities and talked about the primary Hindu beliefs. When we met in February to look at Confucianism, we dined on Chinese food, talked about Confucian beliefs and reviewed the life and teachings of Confucius.

In March, the youth group returned to the Fryeburg church to discuss the Islamic faith. We ate Mediterranean pizza and listened to Ian Wellinghurst guide us through the life of Mohammad, basic teachings of the Qur'an, Muslim beliefs and practices (including a Google Earth aerial photo of Mecca), and a review of the Five Pillars of Islam.
